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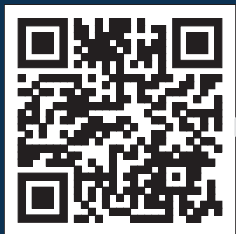
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Dear Resident,

In 2021, I was delighted to have been elected to the Welsh Parliament to represent my home region of South Wales Central – which covers Cardiff, the Vale of Glamorgan and Rhondda Cynon Taf.

In that time, I have worked hard to be the representative this area deserves: speaking regularly in the Chamber, supporting those who need my help, and helping dozens of charities, community groups and businesses throughout the region.

As a member of the Welsh Parliament's Local Government and Housing Committee, I have been working closely with my colleagues to address issues and concerns relating to affordable housing, second homes, homelessness and council tax, and as a Member of the Petitions Committee, I would like to think that I have worked hard to give a strong voice for those who are campaigning for genuine and worthwhile change.

I also sit on a number of cross party groups, and I am especially proud of being the Chair of the Cross Party Group for Liver Disease and Liver Cancer – it's a group looking to inform, raise awareness, and transform services in Wales for those who have been diagnosed with these terrible illnesses.

With all this in mind, I have created my first 'Annual Review' to highlight some of the work that I have been doing. It's by no means a comprehensive list, but does shed a little light on the work of the past year.

PROMOTING OUR REGION



Over the previous year, I have taken every opportunity to visit some of our fantastic charities, businesses, community groups and community projects.

One such project is the brilliant Rhondda Tunnel Society, who are looking to reopen the old Blaencwm to Blaengwynfi railway line - which goes underground and links the Rhondda and Afan Valleys together. This terrific project, which is supported by a team of dedicated volunteers, aims to repurpose the old railway line and create Europe's longest tunnel for cyclists and walkers. It would have substantial health and tourist benefits and I'm keen to get this tunnel reopened. As such, I am doing everything that I can to support it, by lobbying both the Welsh and the UK Government.

CAMPAIGNING FOR CHANGE



As someone who suffers from hearing loss and wears hearing aids, I'm keen to do all that I can to help those in a similar position - it's one of my top priorities.

Sadly, hearing loss has a massive impact on cognitive decline, and leads to significant risk of social isolation, loneliness, dementia and mental health issues. It also has an impact on a child's early development.

Frustratingly, the NHS in Wales only contracts private opticians, dentists, doctors, and pharmacists to offer free NHS services, and refuses to do so for audiologists. This has led to long waiting lists just for people to have a hearing test, let alone be fitted for hearing aids, and I am actively challenging this.

FIGHTING FOR SAFER ROADS



One of the main issues raised with me is that of speeding vehicles and dangerous driving, and sadly, this is an issue that blights the entire region that I represent.

One local group that has contacted me about this issue is Brynna and Taff Ely Bridleways – it's made up of horse and carriage riders from throughout the South Wales Central Region.

They not only face the constant threat of dangerous drivers but are slowly losing their historic bridleways and trails. As such, I'm working closely with them to make sure that the concerns of the horse-riding community are fully taken into account by both local and national governments and that the Active Travel Plan considers their needs when designing roads.

IMPROVING OUR SCHOOLS



I'm eager to do all that I can to make sure that children living in South Wales benefit from a first-class education. This not only means challenging and holding to account the Welsh Government for any decisions it might make on education, but it also means holding to account local councils. St Monica's Church-in-Wales Primary School in Cardiff is a classic example. It's a great school, but it has started to show its age and is in urgent need of investment.

Water runs down the inside walls, black mould is everywhere, and it's been covered in scaffolding for over four years. After openly challenging the Welsh Education Minister to intervene, funding has now been released and work has finally started.

PRESERVING OUR HERITAGE



As a firm believer that our historic environment is an important part of who we are, I've been fighting hard with local residents to protect, not only our open spaces and parklands, such as Hailey Park and the Maindy Velodrome in Cathays, but local buildings which are extremely important to us.

One such example is Cowbridge Old Girl's School, which not only has historical significance, being the first dedicated all-girls school in the UK, but has immense importance to the town.

I've been actively involved in resident action groups, I've lead debates in Senedd about giving people a greater voice on how their communities develop, and I've been campaigning to make it easier for buildings to be purchased and saved.



OPPOSING SENEDD EXPANSION

There has been a lot of coverage in the media about the proposed expansion of the Welsh Parliament from 60 members to 96. There are also plans to get rid of constituencies and create 'super regions', which will then elect their representatives along political party lines.

I'm really concerned about these proposals, which are estimated to cost in excess of £100,000,000, and I believe that this money should be spent on providing better public services, improving our schools and supporting our fantastic NHS.

CHALLENGING THE WELSH GOVERNMENT



As an opposition member of the Welsh Parliament, one of my key roles is to challenge and hold to account the Welsh Government, and over the previous year, I'd like to think that I have done this by highlighting its record on highway investment and infrastructure.

Indeed, I was the first Member to raise concerns regarding the Welsh Government's consultation on turning sections of the A470 and M4 into toll roads, and I have been heavily involved in discussing this matter in the Senedd Chamber. I have also continually expressed concern over its 'roads review' programme, which has not only caused confusion within the highway industry but has done nothing to solve our congested roads and improve our economic prospects.

Yn wir, fi oedd yr Aelod cyntaf i fynegi pryderon ynghylch ymgynghorïad Llywodraeth Cymru ar droi rhannau o'r A470 a'r M4 yn dollffyrdd, ac rydw i wedi bod wrthi'n trafod y mater hwn yn Siambr y Senedd. Rydw i hefyd wedi mynegi pryderon parhaus am ei rhaglen 'adolygu ffyrdd', sydd wedi peri dryswch o fewn y diwydiant priffyrdd ond sydd heb wneud dim i ddistewi ein ffyrdd a gwellia ein rhagolygon economaidd.

Un enghraifft o'r fath yw hen Ysgol y Merched y Bont-faen, sydd nid yn unig ag arwyddocaâ hanesyddol yn sgil y ffath ma hi oedd yr ysgol i ferched yn unig gyntaf yn y DL, ond mae hi hefyd yn hy nod bwysig i'r dref. Rydw i wedi bod yn cymryd rhan flaenllaw mewn grwpiau gweithredu preswylwyr. Rydw i wedi arwain dadleuon yn y Senedd am roi mwyl o lais i bobl ar sut mae eu cymunedau'n datblygu, ac rydw i wedi bod yn ymgyrchu i'w gwneud yn haws i allu prynu ac achub adeiladau.

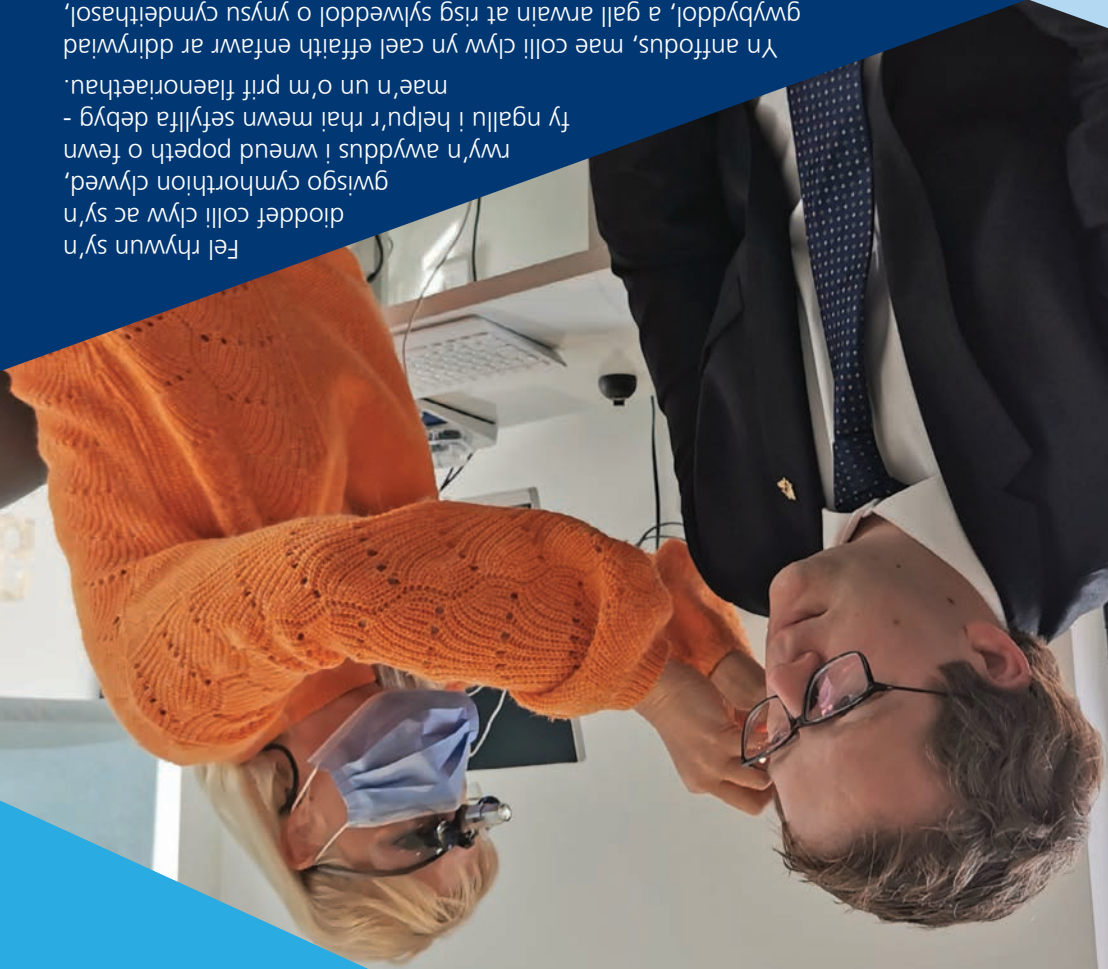


HYRWYDDO EIN RHANBARTH

Cunwyt Bresswyllydd,



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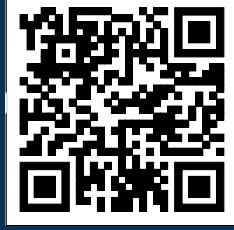
